Get to Know ECONOMICS

Economics is the scientific study of how people and institutions make choices concerning the use of society's scarce resources. Economics is a broad social science that shares common interests with both the behavioral sciences (e.g. sociology and psychology) and the decision sciences (e.g. finance and management).

The importance of economic analysis is recognized by being the only social science in which a Nobel Prize is awarded. Economics students receive training in the methods and uses of economic analysis as applied to households, businesses, and governments.



Macroeconomics focuses on the economy as a whole. Students learn what causes recessions and what drives employment, household consumption, inflation, and interest rates. Other topics include business investment, foreign trade, fiscal policy, and monetary policy. Microeconomics focuses on the individual decisions of consumers and the firm. Students learn about the forces that shape demand and supply and what influences consumer behavior and the profit-maximizing decisions of firms. Other topics include costs, resources, externalities, and monopoly power.

An economics degree helps prepare students for careers in business, government, consulting, and law. In the corporate world, economists analyze financial data and make economic forecasts to help businesses make better decisions. In consulting, economists provide market analysis or policy evaluations to private firms or government agencies. In the public sector, economists research markets or develop policies for such agencies as the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the Federal Reserve, or state and local governments. Economists are also sought out as analysts for the State Department and the Central Intelligence Agency. The flexibility of the economics major across a wide variety of industries is reflected in the relatively high starting salaries and lifetime earnings of economists.

Flexible CHOICES

Undergraduates at Mississippi State University may pursue an economics major through either the College of Business (BBA degree) or through the College of Arts and Sciences (BA degree). Business Economics majors at Mississippi State University can enhance their degree by pairing it with other majors in the College of Business. Combining economics with accounting enhances employability and prepares students for potential roles in budgeting and compliance. A finance minor prepares students for banking, investing, or consulting roles. These combinations allow students to customize their education and expand their career opportunities.

Course HIGHLIGHTS

In advanced coursework, economics majors at Mississippi State University are exposed to some of the most popular fields in economics including labor economics, public finance, and international economics. Economics majors complete the program with a capstone course in econometrics, where they learn how to use statistics and other data analytic techniques to examine economic data. These courses offer a well-rounded education for diverse career opportunities. Students can enhance their experience by participating in the Economics Club, where they can learn about job opportunities and discuss current economic events and issues with prominent guest speakers.
