

# Get to Know FINANCE

At Mississippi State University, the finance major in the Department of Finance and Economics is one of the most sought-after majors in the College of Business. The BBA in finance prepares students for careers in commercial banking, financial institutions, and financial departments within corporations and government organizations. Finance plays a central role in the operation of the economy and is crucial to an organized society's resource allocation system.



Individuals often come in contact with financial instruments (money, stocks, bonds, etc.) and financial institutions (banks, thrifts, insurance companies, etc.); thus, they need to understand the role of the financial system in managing their lifetime financial portfolio. Finance majors acquire the knowledge and skills to help individuals and companies make decisions regarding allocation of scarce resources through analyzing accounting data, utilizing economic concepts, and applying statistical tools in the valuation of financial and real assets.

The finance discipline focuses on the application of mathematics, statistical analysis, technology, and ethics to the decision-making process. A finance major will develop critical thinking and problem-solving skills necessary for careers in banking, corporate finance, investments, and real estate.

For specialization, students may choose from a list of electives based on their interests and career preparation needs. Popular minors include accounting and economics. For those interested in working in the insurance industry, they can add a concentration in risk management and insurance (RMI). Every spring, RMI students can engage directly with industry professionals through dedicated networking events at MSU's annual Insurance Day.

To maximize the benefits of the finance degree, students are strongly encouraged to work closely with a faculty advisor to secure an internship and develop their personal program of study. Outside the classroom, students can participate in case study competitions, career fairs, networking and skill-building events, undergraduate research, and other experiential learning opportunities.

#### Flexible CHOICES

Finance students at Mississippi State University can enhance their degree by pairing it with other majors in the College of Business. Combining finance with accounting enhances employability and prepares students for potential roles in auditing, tax planning, corporate accounting, or investment banking. An economics minor can sharpen quantitative skills and prepare students for forecasting or financial analyst roles. A concentration in risk management and insurance prepares students to work in the insurance industry where they might investigate a claim, analyze a risk, or explain a policy to a client. These combinations allow students to customize their education and expand their career opportunities.

#### **Course HIGHLIGHTS**

The finance program at Mississippi State University offers select courses designed to provide hands-on experience and specialized knowledge. Notable courses include TVA Panel I and II where students analyze and select funds for a Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) trust. Students design long-term investment strategies, place trades, and present performance reports to the TVA. In the Advanced Bank Management course, a student team partners with a locally owned bank to compete in the national Conference of State Bank Supervisors Community Bank Case Study Competition. Students conduct an original case study on a current topic relevant to the banking industry. These courses, along with the ability to pair finance with other business majors, offer a well-rounded education for diverse career opportunities.
